Liz Beaven

Liz Beaven has over 30 years experience in Waldorf education, spanning class teaching, school administration, adult education, research, consulting, and public speaking. She has wide experience in board and committee work. Liz was born and raised in New Zealand and is the proud parent of two adult sons (both Waldorf graduates) and grandparent of three. She first encountered Waldorf education as a young parent in New York City. Liz has been involved in Public Waldorf education almost from its beginning, working in teacher preparation and professional development. She is passionate about questions of inclusion and social justice, and believes that the impulse of Waldorf education has much to offer education in general. The former Administrator of the Sacramento Waldorf School and former President of Rudolf Steiner College, Liz is currently a faculty member of the California Institute of Integral Studies in San Francisco, where she is planning for a graduate program in integral teacher education, and a consultant with several public and private schools.

Anna Rainville

Anna Rainville has been involved in Waldorf education for 40 years. Her experience includes being a class teacher at the Lexington Waldorf School, MA, and the Waldorf School of the Peninsula, CA, as well as, an award-winning kindergarten teacher in public school. Anna was a founding teacher of the Public School Institute for 25 years at the Rudolf Steiner College where she also received her remedial training. Her book, Singing Games for Families, Schools, and Communities, is used by many. Anna loves to sing and support the creative spirit of all teachers. She travels widely as a mentor and is especially delighted to work with the growing summer initiative at Ocean Charter.

Stephanie Becker

Stephanie Becker is an experienced educator who began her career as a Waldorf class teacher at Ocean Charter School in 2012. She looped through the middle school grades twice, during which time she helped to develop and strengthen the middle school program at OCS. Stephanie also taught the choir elective for several years in addition to her role as class teacher. After graduating her last eighth grade class, Stephanie spent a year at the Pasadena Waldorf School working as a middle school Math and English specialist while deepening her understanding of anthroposophy. Stephanie picked up a first grade class in 2018 at OCS. She has spent years refining her talent as an artist, and her passion for art shines through the elaborate chalkboard drawings she creates for her students.

Paola Schouten

Paola Schouten was born in the Netherlands where she received her BA in Education. She came to the US in the eighties and worked in private Waldorf schools, and was one of the founders of the public charter school Journey in Orange County.
