## Community Gathering \#1, June 2,2020

Close to 100 OCS community members participated in our first Community Gathering since the nationwide protests began. Parents/caregivers, teachers, staff, and administration gathered virtually via zoom for some whole group and some affinity group time together. Facilitation was provided by ombudsperson Deborah Fryman; school psychologist Jane Hamilton; OCS parents and Diversity and Equity work group leaders Jessica Martin and Dominique Dje Dje; School Counselors Trennell Palacio and Adam Bruno; OCS teachers Ms. Aly, Ms. Jen, Ms. Brenan, Ms. Groom, Ms. Schmidt, and Ms. Smith; and OCS parent Alyson Shelton with zoom support provided by OCS teacher Mr. Ryan. Feedback from the gathering indicates that OCS' indigenous, black and people of color want more of the safe space, dialogue, and community they experienced in their affinity group and OCS' white participants want more training about race and racism.

Teachers are working to gather resources to be more culturally relevant and inclusive in their lessons and classroom practices and have expressed a strong desire for training in diversity, equity and inclusion. It has been emphasized that the process in which we are engaged is a marathon, not a sprint.

## ACADEMIC PROGRAMS:

## End of Year Reports and Report Cards:

OCS families will receive their child's narrative End of Year Report and Report Card for middle schoolers by the end of June. Teacher's reports will include a curricular overview of the year as well as personalized feedback for each student in academic, artistic, and social-emotional areas. In the middle school, students receive letter grades in all academic subjects and specialties, with longer comments about social-emotional growth and citizenship shared in their end of year reports.

## CARE Team:

CARE team work continues over summer as needed, from technical support to language support to mental health support. The CARE team will be part of planning for re-opening in the various scenarios as each one poses particular benefits and challenges for segments of our school population.

## Re-opening Plans:

Administration continues to stay abreast of weekly if not daily updates from the California Department of Education and State Superintendent; the Los Angeles County Department of Education; LAUSD; the California Charter Schools Association; the Young, MInney, and Corr legal team; ExEd, and the Alliance for Public Waldorf Education. While some guidelines have been released related to schools re-opening in the fall, many issues remain unresolved. Included in these still unresolved issues are: how will attendance be calculated, can independent charters make their own choices about re-opening or must they follow their authorizing district's policy, how will school
funding be affected by hybrid versions of distance learning and in person learning, how will schools cover the increased costs of in person learning due to Covid 19, and more.

## Distance Learning/Hybrid version:

Administration is conducting a survey of OCS families to understand their current perspectives about possible scenarios for next year, including what type of information parents want about cleaning and sanitizing and personal protective equipment to which type of model might best meet their needs. Scenarios being considered include a full distance learning option to various hybrid scenarios, including the following:

- all students learn remotely for one day per week; students then attend half days the other 4 days
- all students learn remotely for 1 day per week; students then attend school every other day for two full days per week and join via video on the other two days
- all students learn remotely one day; students attend one day per week in person; students with greater needs (students with special needs, English language learners, students not yet performing at grade level) attend in person the other two days as other students participate via video
