# Parent Tours and Information Meetings:

We had three more successful and well-attended Parent Tours and Information meetings on January 11<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and 25<sup>th.</sup> Every seat was filled and in some cases there was standing room only with a total of 60-80 interested parents! Given the demand, we have scheduled additional tours and information meetings in the upcoming months.

As of today, 1/31/17, we have received **540** applications for the 2017-2018-enrollment lottery. (This is compared to 507 applications received by this same date last year.)

### **ACADEMIC PROGRAMS:**

#### Curriculum:

Joint Dr. Martin Luther King Assembly:

OCS and WESM will again host a joint assembly in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. on February 16<sup>th</sup>. The assembly will be at 8:45am in the auditorium and parents are invited. The assembly will feature performances by students from both schools as well as a performance by Mr. Gerald Rivers, OCS percussion teacher and the voice of Dr. King.

#### English Language Arts:

Younger grades (1<sup>st</sup>- 4<sup>th</sup>) are working with leveled reading materials to better support students' growth in the areas of reading fluency and comprehension. This approach compliments, not supplants, the oral story telling that is central to main lesson and key to building comprehension, vocabulary, critical thinking, and ethical thinking.



Older grades (4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>) are developing grade level writing prompts and rubrics to ensure students are progressing in their mastery of grade level writing. Teachers will use these writing samples to generate more consistent evaluation of student writing, with the final outcome of clearer and more consistent expectations for grade level student writing across the grades.

### **Internal Benchmark Assessments:**

First grade students completed their first internal benchmark assessments using EasyCBM for English Language Arts and Math this month as one method of tracking student progress. Second-eighth grade students completed a second set of internal benchmark assessments this month. The internal assessment results combined with teacher made assessments are used to determine which students need academic intervention support. Our intervention teachers target specific skills such as decoding/phonics, reading fluency, reading comprehension, math fluency, and math concepts based on students' needs.
