Bio: Sue Ingles

Dr. Sue Ann Ingles received her doctorate in Biostatistics from the UCLA School of Public Health in 1993. She is currently Associate Professor of Preventive Medicine and Obstetrics & Gynecology at the University of Southern California and is founding Director of the USC Program in Molecular Epidemiology. Over the past 10 years she has received, as Principal Investigator, over \$6 million in grant support from the National Institutes of Health, the California Cancer Research Programs, and the Department of Defense. She is well-known for her work on gene-environment interaction in cancer susceptibility, and has authored more than 100 peer-reviewed scientific publications.

Dr. Ingles has more than 20 years experience as an educator. She has mentored post-doc, professional, and graduate students, as well as high school students from a number of local high schools. She teaches graduate and undergraduate courses at USC, has developed a number of new courses, and has served on USC curriculum development committees. She is mother to two students at Ocean Charter School, where she has volunteered as first grade Handwork Assistant, and currently, as coach to the Middle School Math Olympiads team. She has a deep interest in Waldorf education and is currently enrolled in the Summer High School Teacher Training program at Rudolf Steiner College in Sacramento.
