#### **Internal Benchmark Assessments:**

First grade students will complete their first internal benchmark assessments using EasyCBM for English Language Arts and Math in mid January as one method of tracking student progress. The internal assessment results combined with teacher made assessments are used to determine which students need academic intervention support. Our intervention teachers target specific skills such as decoding/phonics, reading fluency, reading comprehension, math fluency, and math concepts based on students' needs.
