ADMINISTRATION

Del Rey Campus Update:

ACG Meeting and Habit Life at School and Home Part 1:

Approximately thirty-five parents gathered in the DR library on Friday, September 29th to hear a lecture presented by Kindergarten teachers, Ms. Marlene and Mr. Castillo. The focus of the talk was that all of life has a rhythm, the calendar, the seasons, the day, what we eat, and when we sleep. The Waldorf rhythm of color for each day is as follows: Monday – purple, Tuesday – red, Wednesday – yellow, Thursday – orange, Friday – green, Saturday – blue, and Sunday – white. There is rhythm in the color of each grade in Waldorf Education. The rhythm of the heartbeat is aligned with spoken and sung curriculum. Rhythm and routine help children to feel calm and safe.

Westchester Campus Update:

High School Information Night:

A wonderful group of parents of alumni with Ms. Kristy shared their processes of researching high schools and finding the right one for their child. The large crowd of 6th-8th grade parents and students learned about the wide variety of high school options in Los Angeles; the magnet point system; the financial aide application process for private schools; and much, much more. Diversity and Equity Committee:

The committee continues its work to support our diverse families in becoming familiar with Waldorf Education, as well as our work to reflect the wonderful diversity of our school community in our curriculum and festivals. Specifically, the committee focused on the Festival of Courage at the end of September. Our next festival will be the Festival of Light as we move towards the darker time of our year. The group of roughly 20 parents engaged in conversation about their personal experiences of diversity as well as asked questions about the goals of the committee. Charter Renewal:

Our intake appointment to submit the Charter Renewal Petition is scheduled for Thursday, November 16, 2017. The purpose of this meeting is for the Charter School Division to verify that all the required pieces of the petition application are present. Prior to the intake appointment, the OCS Board will need to review and approve the Charter Renewal Petition at the November 2, 2017 Board meeting.

Mentoring for Faculty members new to OCS:

All seven teachers new to OCS continue to participate in ongoing training with individual mentor teacher(s). In recognition that jumping into chalkboard drawing and wet-on-wet painting can be a daunting task at first, we offered a six-day intensive technique class led by Ms. Mendoza. The goal is to help teachers develop techniques for chalkboard drawing and wet-on-wet painting so that they are able to incorporate these skills into their daily lesson planning. As needed, teachers are also receiving targeted support for singing and recorder playing from Joan Newton, long-time Waldorf educator and regular OCS singing instructor.
