## **Del Rey Campus Update:**

## ACADEMIC PROGRAMS:

#### Internal Benchmark Assessments:

The standardized internal benchmark assessments (EasyCBM) that OCS uses multiple times each year to track student progress in math and language arts have been given to all grades, 2<sup>nd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>. 1<sup>st</sup> grade students will take their first assessment at the mid-year mark in January. Teachers use these assessments to track progress and inform instruction.

#### Intervention Services:

Intervention services have begun for students in 1st through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Kinder students may participate later in the year. Intervention services are provided by our lead intervention teachers with support from intervention assistants. Services are targeted at supporting students to reach grade level expectations in reading, writing, and math.
