## **Educational Program**

### LAUSD Annual Performance-Based Oversight Visit

The annual Performance-Based Oversight visit is scheduled January 26<sup>th</sup>. The Admin Team prepared for the visit by providing the Charter Schools Division the majority of the requested documents prior to the Winter break. OCS will be reviewed in each of the following areas and will receive a score based on a 4-point rubric.

Category I: Governance

Category II: Student Achievement and Educational Performance Category III: Organizational Management, Programs, and Operations

Category IV: Fiscal Operations

#### Alliance for Public Waldorf Education

Chamomile Nusz, Alliance Board Member and Membership Director came all the way from Wisconsin to visit OCS on December 13<sup>th</sup>. She was delighted to tour the campus, visit classrooms, and observe our amazing teachers and students in action! We discussed the process of Ocean becoming a full member of the Alliance through the process of self-study, including the 7 Core Principles of Waldorf Education.

#### Gradalis Curriculum Frameworks

OCS teachers will begin working with the Gradalis Curriculum Frameworks that help to clarify the key anchor skills, foundational skills and scaffolding skills by grade level in public Waldorf school classrooms. The grade-level frameworks



were developed by Prairie Adams and Bonnie River of Gradalis to support teachers navigating the challenging task of public school standards and Waldorf, developmentally-attuned practices. The frameworks are dense and will require ongoing exploration, study and implementation by our faculty.

## Extended Learning Opportunities (ELOs)

- The second ELO this year at OCS was offered during the winter break. 19 students enrolled for the first of the two week/ 4 days/week program and 10 enrolled for the second week. Due to low attendance during week 2, OCS will offer only the first week next year.
- The first extended learning opportunity of this year was offered during the Thanksgiving break. Twenty-three students were enrolled for the threeday opportunity hosted by OCS staff.
- Additional ELOs will be available during the holiday breaks, including:
   Winter break, Renewal week, and Spring break.
- These offerings include academic support in Reading, Writing and Math with project-based learning activities to support students' foundational skills and foster their excitement about learning.
- Offerings also include art-based enrichment, movement and games, and social interactions to support healthy social emotional development.

#### LCAP Revisions

LAUSD's Charter School Division (CSD) sent OCS a Notice of Concern regarding required revision of the LCAP on Nov.18, 2022. Administration met with our CSD specialist the day we received the notice to review their comments. Administration has revised OCS' LCAP for Board review and approval at the January Board meeting.

### **UPK Grant Expenditure Report**

The UPK Grant Expenditure Report, due to the CDE 12/31/22 was completed and submitted on 12/20/22. The expenditures totaled \$40,667 and included partial salaries/benefits of classified employees, and one certificated employee, as well as classroom materials.

Arts, Music and Instructional Materials Block Grant Plan Highlights of the OCS Arts, Music, and Instructional Materials Block Grant draft plan include: professional development for our faculty, specialty teacher salaries, and specialty class instructional materials. The draft plan will be reviewed and voted on by the Board during the Finance section of the meeting.

# **Operations**

# Health updates

With the return to school on January 3<sup>rd</sup>, all OCS students and staff members were provided 2 COVID tests to use prior to returning on Tuesday. All students and staff are required to report any positive results only.



## **Universal Meal Program**

- Roughly 90 breakfast meals served daily
- Between 230 250 lunch meals served daily
- Changes in the kitchen layout have resulted in more efficient meal service during lunch
- OCS purchased our own compostable utensils rather than purchasing through the lunch vendor to reduce costs.

## **Outreach & Enrollment**

#### School Tours

- Campus tours and information meetings held during the instructional day for new and prospective parents continue on a monthly basis.
- Tours are limited to 50 people to minimize classroom disruptions.
- To accommodate the high demand for tours/information sessions, the schedule has been updated to include additional in person evening times.

### High School Info Night

Administration will host OCS' annual High School Information Night on Jan. 9<sup>th</sup> from 6-7pm via zoom. This event is an opportunity for OCS families, especially middle school families, to learn about high school options and the process of finding the right school for their child after graduating from OCS.

# Alumni Night

OCS will welcome alumni back to share about their transition to high school, their own high school experience and (perhaps) about their transition to college as OCS graduates on February 27<sup>th</sup>. This event will be held in person and is an opportunity for alumni to see each other as well as for current OCS students and parents to learn about life after OCS.
