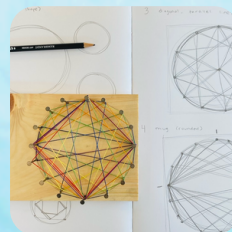

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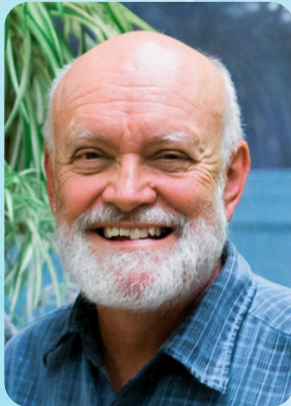
1ST GRADE LEAD: MARI SHINTANI

Rumi's words, "When you do things from your soul, you feel a river moving in you, a joy," capture Mari Shintani's deep passion for teaching. Born in Japan, with a soul rooted in Panama and a heart in Hawaii, Mari's teaching journey spans over 25 years. After earning a Bachelor of Science and studying Horticulture and Marine Science at the University of Hawaii, she shifted to education as a path to inspiration. She earned her Montessori Early Childhood certification in Jakarta, Indonesia, and her Waldorf Elementary certification at the Honolulu Waldorf School. Mari began teaching first grade in 2002 and is thrilled to join the Ocean Charter School and Summer Institute community. In addition to teaching, she is a certified life coach, health coach, CranioSacral Therapy practitioner, and a certified mentor for teachers through the Center for Anthroposophy.



2ND GRADE LEAD: BONNIE RIVER

Bonnie has been a Waldorf Educator for over 50 years and has worked and taught at all levels from early childhood, through the grades and into high school. She is a founder of Gradalis, a Waldorf Teacher Training Institute and has taught in many areas of the trainings. Her love is fostering a teacher's relationship to the children and mentoring active teachers along their way. She is a main contributor to the Gradalis Waldorf Curriculum Frameworks and enjoys guiding teachers in understanding how to embed standards within the Main Lesson and single subject lessons. Bonnie holds a California Teaching Credential, a masters in Curriculum and Instruction and Masters in Educational Leadership.



3RD GRADE LEAD: DENNIS DEMANET

Dennis Demanet, born in Kansas, studied at the University of Kansas, the University of Vienna, and Reading University. He began his teaching career in England, where he taught from 1976 to 1984 and completed his teacher training. In 1984, he moved to Hawaii, where he taught grades 7-8, 8, and 3-4 at the Honolulu Waldorf School. There, he met his wife, Susan Pellen, and their son was born. The family then moved to Pine Hill School in New Hampshire, where Dennis taught grades 1-8. In 1997, they relocated to California, where Dennis taught at Pasadena Waldorf School, covering two classes of grades 1-8 and one class of grades 1-4. During the COVID pandemic, he taught grades 5-8 with a group of 12 students and later a 9th-grade English homeschool class. Now retired, Dennis mentors teachers at several schools, including OCS, and has worked with teacher training programs at Rudolf Steiner College, Antioch, WISC, and SI. In retirement, he focuses on gardening and painting.



4TH GRADE LEAD: STEPHANIE KERN

Stephanie Kern is a class teacher with a diverse background in education, art, and anthropology. She earned her degree in Anthropology from the University of Southern California and a Master's in Curatorial Studies from California College of the Arts. Her journey into Waldorf education began through a project on somatic learning with the Exploratorium, which led her to the Waldorf Institute of Southern California in 2014. After serving as a teacher's assistant at Pasadena Waldorf School for four years, Stephanie began teaching her own class at Westside Waldorf School in 2020, navigating the challenges of the pandemic.
