Educational Program

Professional Development:

Deepening OCS' Commitment to Public Waldorf Education:

<u>OCS Summer Institute</u>: Summer Institute registration continues. So far, we have 13 OCS teachers signed up and 1 teacher from another school. I expect a few more sign-ups from other schools as we get closer to the end of the year and teacher placements and hiring is further along.

<u>Building Bridges</u>: The latest Building Bridges in-person session for our 13 participating teachers was held March $28^{th} - 30^{th}$ on site. Topics included speech work and storytelling. May $16 - 18^{th}$ is the next in person session on campus with online sessions in between.

<u>River Moves Mountains Mentoring</u>: The attached report provides an overview of Bonnie River's recent on-site work with OCS teachers.

TK Program:

As our TK students get younger due to the state moving the start age younger (4 years old by Sept. 1st), OCS is examining our TK program to see how we can better meet the needs of our youngest students. Everything from the size of our campus, the way children participate in the lunch program, and the overall structure of the day must be examined from the lens of child development and appropriateness. The CA State TK standards are a helpful and grounding tool in this process as is a solid understanding of child development from a Steiner perspective. Administration is considering hosting a TK orientation program before the start of school 2025-26 to support both children and parents in joining our OCS community.



Operations

<u>Hiring:</u>

Administration has been interviewing, setting up observations, and conducting demo lessons with about 10 class teacher applicants. This process will continue for another few weeks.

Specialty teacher hiring needs are being evaluated. A similar process will be used for specialty teacher hiring as needed.

Staffing needs including intervention assistants and classroom assistants are also being evaluated. A similar process will be followed for these positions as needed with observations and demos in the appropriate setting.

School Climate

Climate survey: The full reports for the community climate surveys are attached. Further analysis will be presented as this round's results are compared to the previous round to further inform school improvement efforts.
